## Oregon National Incident-Based Reporting System (ONIBRS)



“NIBRS captures details on each single crime incident—as well as on separate offenses within the same incident—including information on victims, known offenders, relationships between victims and offenders, arrestees, and property involved in crimes. Unlike data reported through the UCR Program’s traditional Summary Reporting System (SRS)—an aggregate monthly tally of crimes—NIBRS goes much deeper because of its ability to provide circumstances and context for crimes like location, time of day, and whether the incident was cleared. NIBRS can provide more useful statistics to promote constructive discussion, measured planning, and informed policing.” [-https://www.fbi.gov/services/cjis/ucr/nibrs](https://www.fbi.gov/services/cjis/ucr/nibrs)

We continue to report crimes to the FBI via ONIBRS. We have continued to report with low error rates. This year I attended training in January , it was good in-depth training into the system and proper, accurate reporting.

## Alarm Servicing

During 2018 we responded to a total of 118 alarm calls for service.



- ✓ 27 ~ Warning letter sent for chargeable alarms 2 or more offenses.
- ✓ 14 ~ Billed for multiple false alarms 3 or more offenses.
- ✓ 12 ~ Letters sent for need of an alarm permit.
- ✓ 1 ~ Revocation of alarm permit.
- ✓ 1 ~ Actual Burglary alarm response.
- ✓ 0 ~ Reinstatement of alarm permit.

## RECORDS DIVISION

Yearly case file police reports have increased 7% from 2898 reports in 2017 to 3103 reports in 2018.

Per public record retention laws, reports and files no longer required to be maintained were purged. This is a never-ending process. Our report storage consolidation process has upgraded the security and retrieval process for the police reports and other confidential data.

The Welfare Checklist database, which provides information regarding residents who may need extra help during an emergency, was maintained. A copy of the database is also stored with the Cannon Beach Rural Fire Protection District, should access be needed in the event of an emergency or natural disaster.

The Keys on File database, which holds emergency residential keys as a courtesy for local residents, was maintained, also ensuring the keys and information on file for the participating residents was current.

The following permits were issued by the Cannon Beach Police Department office staff in 2018:

- 19 Burn Permits
- 20 Dory Boat Launch Permits
- 48 Beach Driving Permits
  - (Firewood/ Driftwood Collection = 7)
  - (Disabled/ Elderly = 34)
  - (Education/HRAP = 4)
  - (Construction = 3)

Records staff attended a combined 86.5 hours of training in 2018. 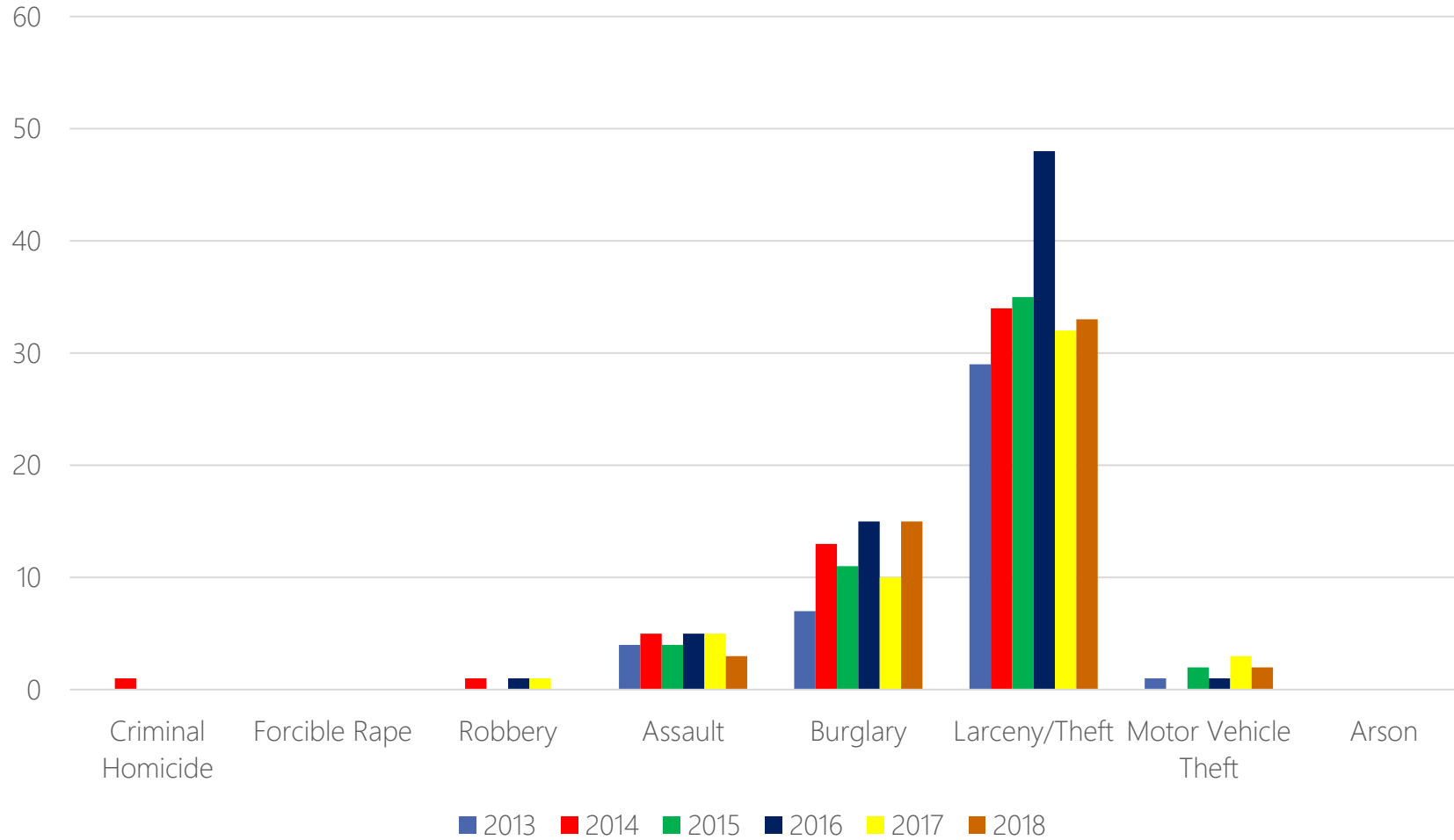
- Responded to multiple requests for K9 assistance – removing Methamphetamine, Heroin, drug paraphernalia, and illegal prescription drugs
- Completed over 60 hours of training
- New K9 vehicle is currently being built replacing current vehicle that has over 168,000 miles on it.

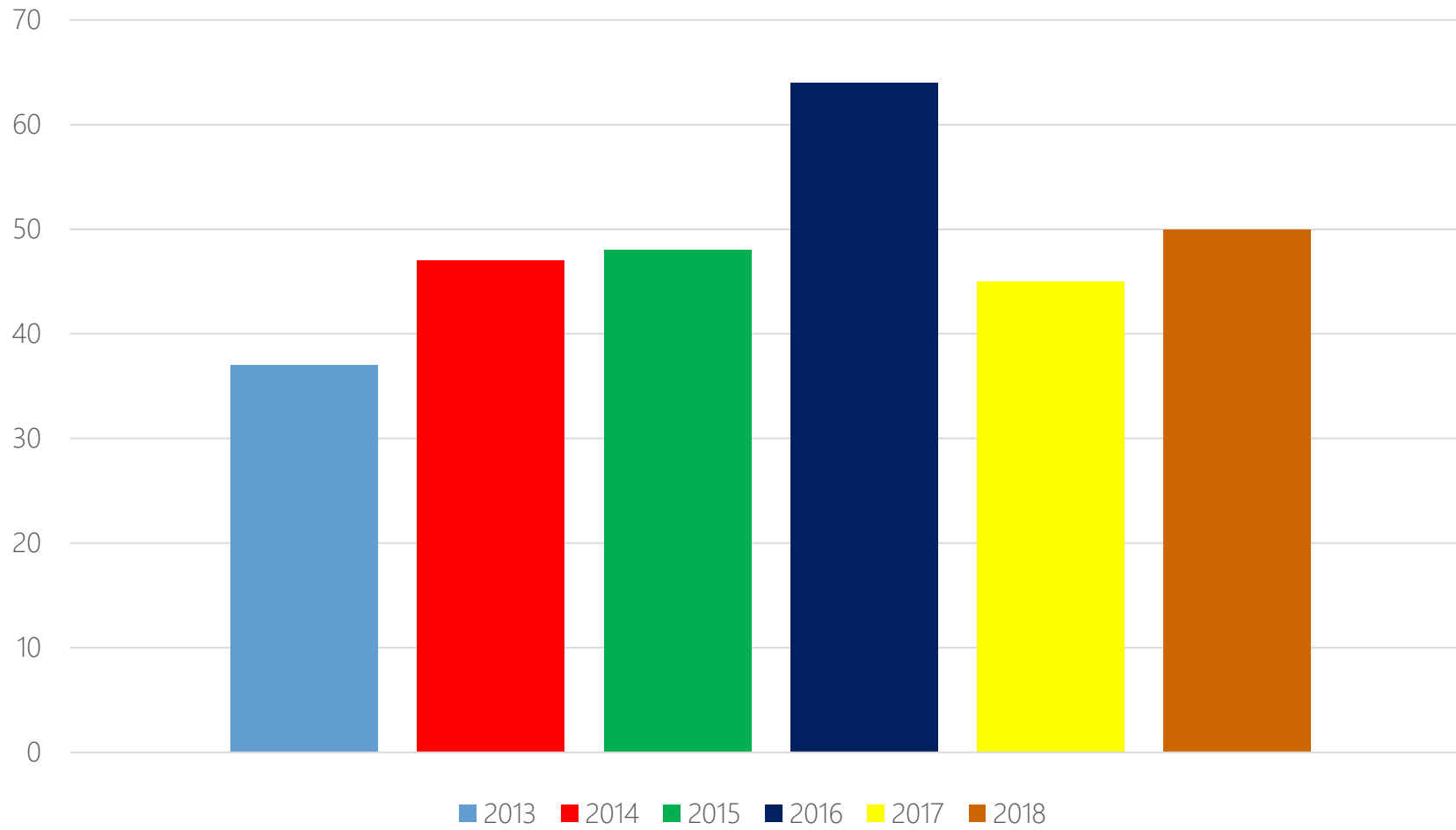

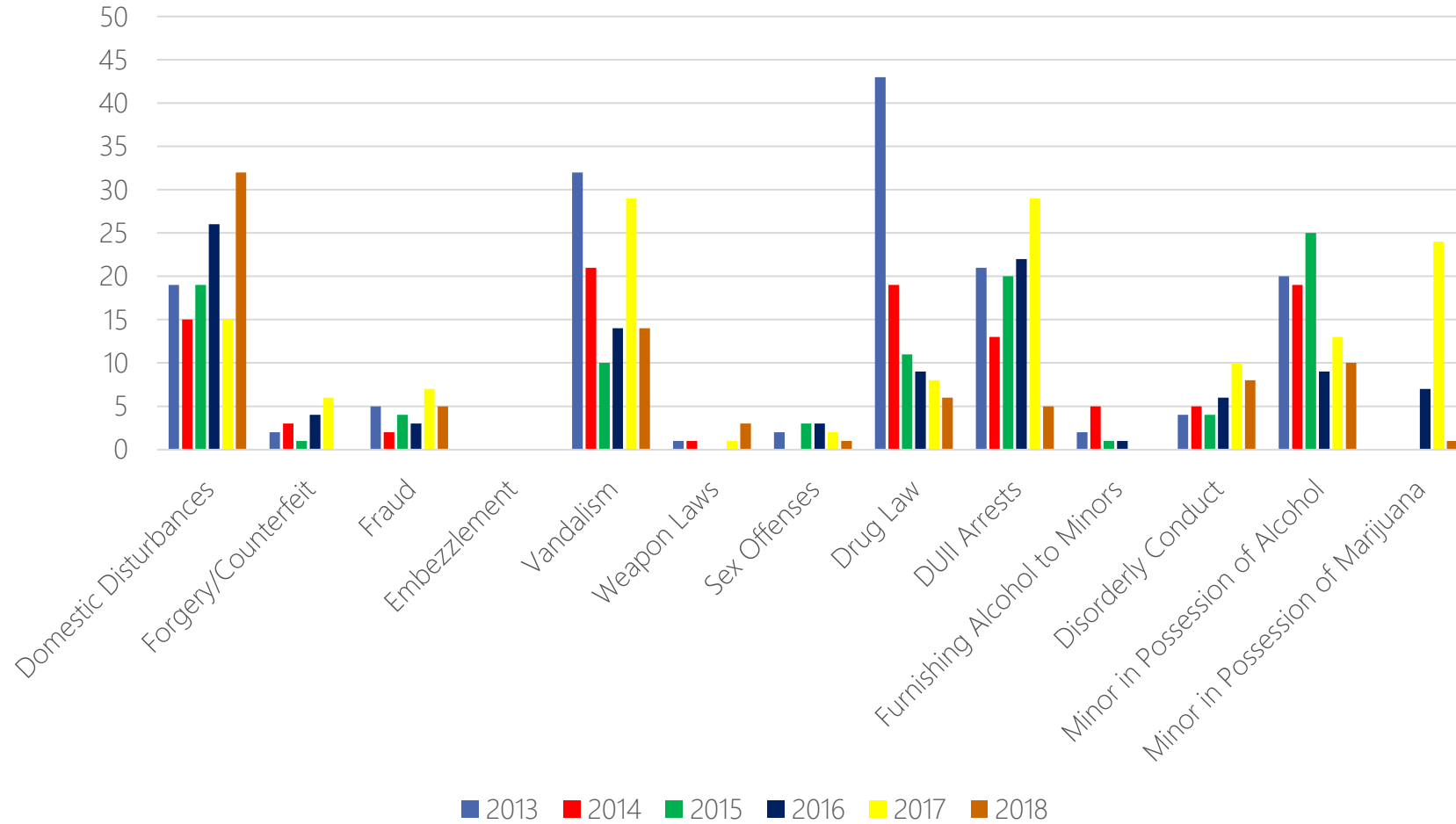




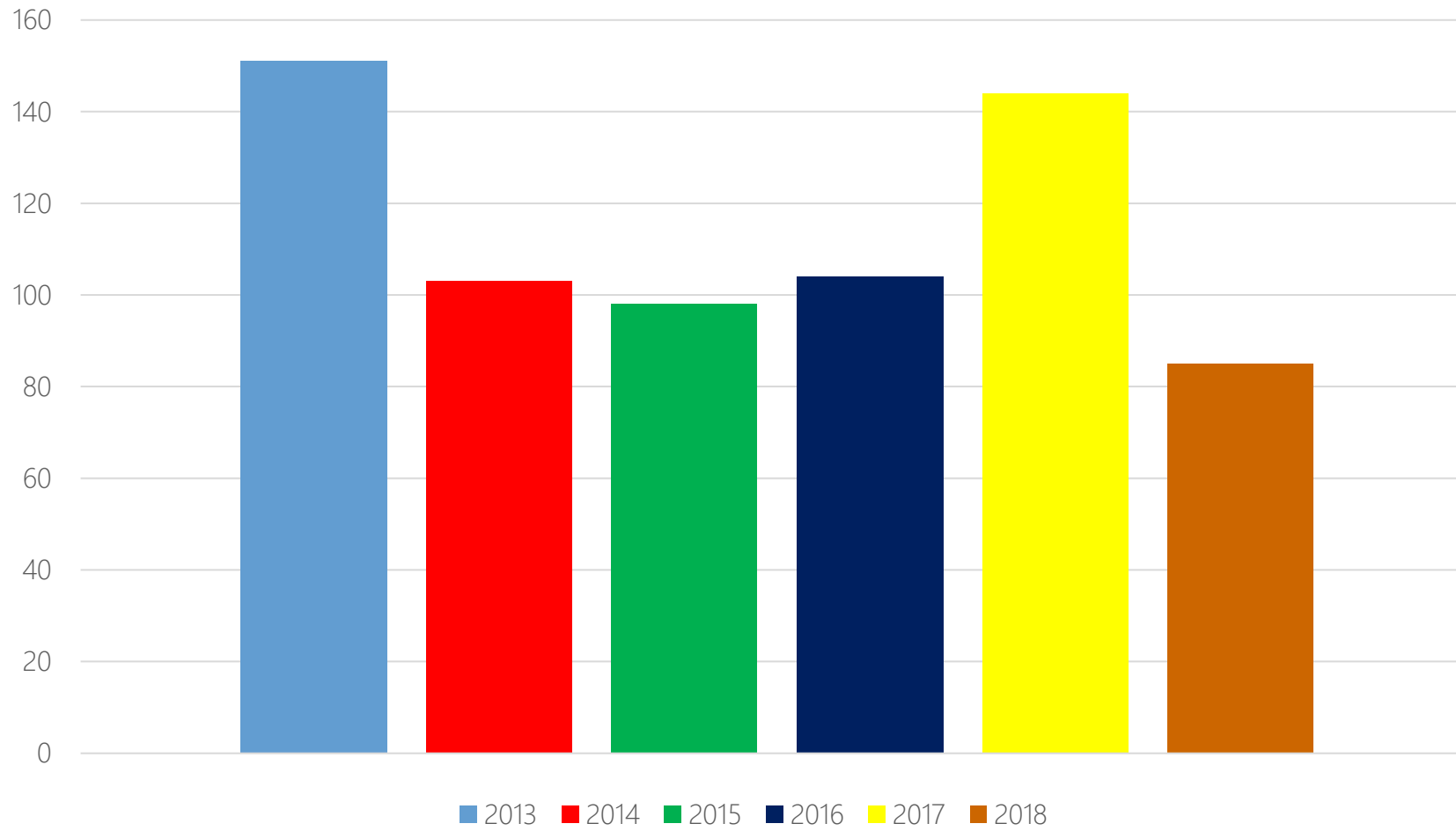
## Cannon Beach Police Department Part I Total Offenses

# 2018 USE OF FORCE REVIEW

There were 7 documented Use of Force incidents in 2018. (14 cases in 2017)

- ❖ 66% occurred after 5pm.
- ❖ 66% involved the use of alcohol.
- ❖ 71% involved the threatened use of the Taser. No suspects were tased.
- ❖ 100% of these suspects were male.
- ❖ 14% involved the use of Physical Force. (hands on)
- ❖ 42% involved drawing the officers weapon. (weapon displayed)
- ❖ There were no citizen complaints regarding any of these Use of Force incidents.
- ❖ One officer was injured during one of these Use of Force incidents (exposure), no suspects were injured.

# Community Emergency Response Team

We graduated another CERT class in 2018 and are now up to 50 CERT members.

Our CERT volunteers gave us over 300 hours of volunteer time.

We lost our great CERT leader Paula Vetter as they have moved to Bend.

Mary Beth Cottle stepped up to fill the leadership role and has done a great job.

We had another combined CERT/MRC drill as well as several meetings and trainings. We also had another great turnout of volunteers on Sandcastle Day.









- We now have 26 members; 3 Physicians, 11 nurses, (four of whom are advanced practice), 1 veterinarian, 1 certified life coach (who is also our county commissioner), 1 paramedic, 1 Environmental Health Specialist, 2 EMT, a Industrial Hygienist, a Naturopath, 1 licensed counselor, an Industrial Hygienist, Radiology Technician, Physicians Assistant and 1 Social Worker.
- In 2018 our MRC members volunteered over 500 hours for the benefit of Cannon Beach. They work very hard and are very dedicated to the health and safety of City of Cannon Beach.
- Lila Wickham and Dr. Bob Wayne are wonderful coordinators.
- They have regularly scheduled meetings, trainings, and participate in drills with CERT as well as on Sandcastle Day.

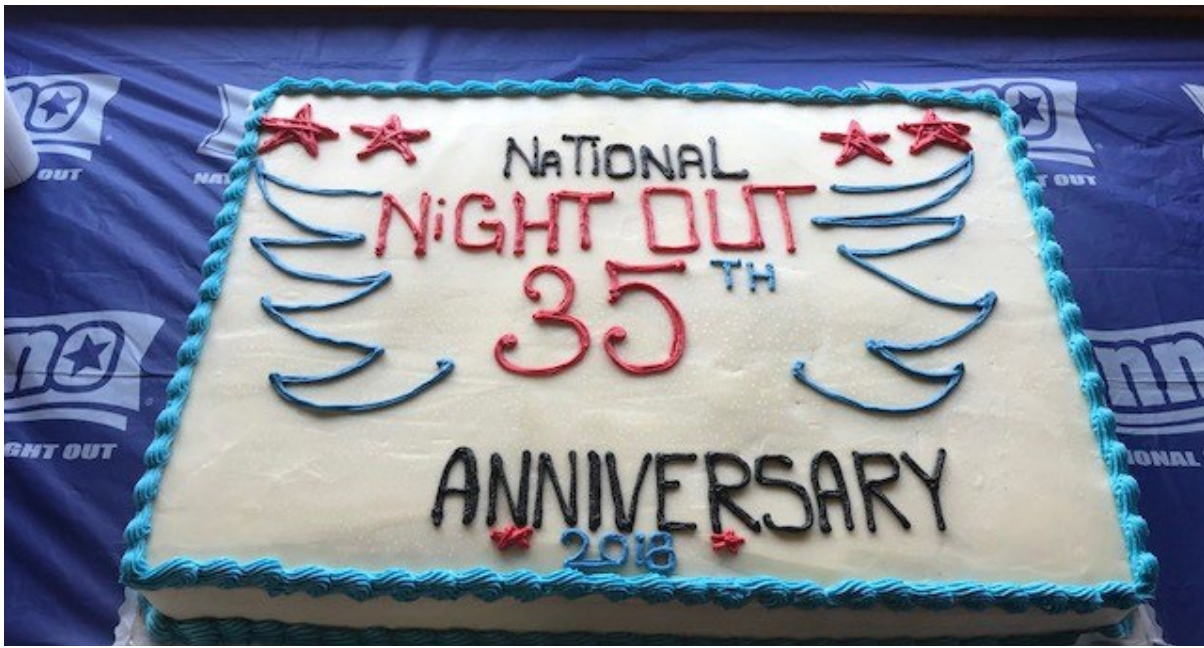
