Water

- Three Black Oystercatcher eggs in the saddle have hatched, this marks the first successful BLOY nest this year and the first time more than two eggs have hatched on Haystack Rock in over 5 years.
- Western Gull, Cormorants, and Tufted Puffins are all currently raising young. Cormorant nests are being monitored for Porland Audubon Society.
- US Fish and Wildlife Services are conducting a coastwide Tufted Puffin nest survey this summer.
