Cache Site Containers Open Saturday, April 15th

Emergency Manager Rick Hudson invites you to join the cache container program, which provides citizens the opportunity to store barrels of supplies safely outside the Tsunami zone.

Opened to the public twice annually for tours and restocking, Cannon Beach's three cache sites will be accessible to visit from 11AM-1PM on Saturday, April 15th.

How the program works: Your personal cache container(s) are stored in secure buildings at the evacuation cache sites. The containers hold your personal cache of supplies to assist you and your family until the emergency passes. The most important and essential items you can store are a tent, tarps, sleeping bags, canned or dried foods, a means to cook or warm them, water, and warm clothing.

Community Workshop on Sea Level Rise Well Attended

A message from City Planner Robert St. Clair

On March 15th the City of Cannon Beach hosted a public workshop for a sea level rise adaptation project that the Department of Oregon Land Conservation and Development (DLCD) is carrying out with local communities in Clatsop County. This project is meant to help coastal communities understand the effects of sea level rise, potential impacts it may have on them, and develop tools and strategies that communities can use to proactively address issues such as flooding and erosion. Information from this project will be used to help DLCD develop and improve their Sea Level Rise Guide and Sea Level Rise Impact Explorer.



This workshop was an opportunity for DLCD to hear directly from interested community members and discuss values and concerns. Approximately 30 people attended, and issues included the siting of city buildings, shoreline protection rules and measures, and the importance of the local environment.

Projects such as this are invaluable opportunities for policy makers, planners, property owners, and partner agencies such as DLCD to collaboratively develop comprehensive and inclusive strategies to address issues that will have significant and long-standing impacts.




