## Cannon Beach a Fireworks-Free Wildlife Safe Zone

A message from Chief of Police Jason Schermerhorn

The 4th of July is fast approaching. In Cannon Beach we want to remind everyone that **ALL** Fireworks are illegal with fines up to \$5,000 for offenders. The City Council unanimously voted in 2020 to entirely ban fireworks, based on the public concerns for fire danger, as well as the concern for sea birds and animals.

During the 4th of July, endangered birds like Tufted Puffins and Black Oyster Catchers are nesting and fireworks cause them to abandon their nest and the chicks can die. We are already experiencing a dry spring season going into summer and the fire risk is a large concern. The CERT teams will work with the Police Dept and Fire Dept to enforce the fireworks ban over the 4th of July holiday and the weekends before and after the 4th.

Thank you for honoring our Fireworks Ban in Cannon Beach. Have a Happy and Safe 4th of July.



# City Welcomes Steve Sokolowski, Community Development Director



Community Development Director Steve Sokolowski

Making the cross-country move from Sheboygan, WI to Cannon Beach was a "nobrainer" for Steve Sokolowski, Cannon Beach's new Community Development Director. Sokolowski and his wife, Dawn, who originally began their professional careers in Hermiston, OR before relocating to Sheboygan to be closer to family, always felt like moving to a place like Cannon Beach could be an eventual natural step.

Sokolowski served for twenty years as the Manager of Planning and Zoning for Sheboygan, WI, on the west coast of Lake Michigan. While Steve loved his community, career, and coworkers, when an opportunity arose with the City of Cannon Beach, the Sokolowskis knew they needed to take the plunge and begin the next phase of their lives.

And what a plunge it has been – in addition to balancing the logistics of uprooting from twenty years with the same community, Sokolowski's first three weeks with the City have required him to dive headfirst into learning about years-long land use contentions, a municipal code currently under review, and an entirely new community – tasks he credits his coworkers Robert St. Clair and Emily Bare as instrumental to. Though this acclimation is daunting, Steve is up to the challenge: "While regulations are generally the same, individual people's needs are not," he explained, identifying community partnership as a priority of his.

Steve sees Cannon Beach as facing many of the same challenges as communities nationwide as far as housing, economics, and reconciling the old with the often necessary new. He feels that the coastal town is set apart by how visible its processes are to the public, and how passionate and interested the community is in its land use processes. Recognizing the community's desire to be actively involved in achieving creative solutions, Steve explained that he has aimed to begin his role by listening to and better understanding the community's concerns and priorities for now and in the future.

Decades of expertise in strategic planning and land use aren't the only things Sokolowski has brought to the table. Like most residents of the north coast, Steve appreciates the unique majesty of the natural world around him. Since arriving in Cannon Beach, he's enjoyed the meditative nature of walks through the Ecola Creek Forest Reserve, evening strolls to the shore, and exploring Oswald West State Park, explaining that "nature is a calming reminder every day" of why he's here.

Sokolowski's move will bring him and Dawn closer to their daughter, Savana, in California, and provide their son Steven, completing his degree in July, with a potential opportunity to come explore the coast. The change also affords Steve the opportunity to explore how he can affect positive change in another community. The ever-changing nature of the job keeps it interesting for Sokolowski, but "noticing incrementally over time the way that individual projects [he's] worked with have culminated to affect the community for the better," makes the work rewarding.

"Everyone has been very welcoming," he said, describing his early experiences assimilating into a tight-knit community of people all hoping to protect what they love: the natural beauty and community character of Cannon Beach. When you see Steve in town, help welcome him to Cannon Beach – he's very much looking forward to joining the community.

## City Announces Updated Utility Rates

Utility rates cover the cost of operations/maintenance and capital projects in the City's 3 utility funds: Water, Wastewater, and Storm Drain. Capital projects are funded through debt in the form of loans and use of reserves from operations.

Cannon Beach City Council approved rate increases to the Wastewater system and the Storm Drain system effective July 1, 2023. Wastewater rates increased 16.2% and Storm Drain increased 30.0%. The wastewater base rate for a ¾" meter is \$33.39 per month with an allowance of 400 cubic feet of usage and is a dollar increase of \$4.65 per month. The storm drain residential base rate increased to 11.99 per month from \$9.22 per month and is a dollar increase of \$2.77 per month. Water rates are not increasing at this time.

The city is conducting a rate study for the 3 utilities and the results will be reviewed by council in the coming months. It is expected that the water rate will be adjusted at that time as well as potential adjustments to the wastewater and storm drain rates at that time.

# ODF Raises Fire Danger Level to Moderate in Northwest Oregon

As the warmer weather increases the temperatures in the northwest corner of the state, fire managers will be increasing the fire danger level to Moderate (blue) for the Public Use Restrictions in the Northwest 1, 2, and 3 (NW-1, NW-2, and NW-3) weather zones. This change will be effective at 1:00 a.m. on Thursday, June 29, 2023.

Campfires will only be allowed at designated camping sites. Dispersed campfires will no longer be allowed. Motorists traveling on forest roads are required to have a shovel and one gallon of water or a 2.5 lb. or larger ABC fire extinguisher. Non-industrial use of chain saws is allowed.

In conjunction with the county fire chiefs, a county wide burn ban remains in effect.

Open debris burning has not be allowed since June 14. Burn barrels require a burning permit, which can be obtained through the Oregon Department of Forestry or a local fire department depending on the location of the residence. For rural residences using burn barrels: only metal barrels in good condition covered by heavy mesh screens with holes no larger than ¼ inch are acceptable. A charged water supply and hand tools are required to be on site.

The Industrial Fire Precaution levels (IFPL) for NW-1, NW-2, and NW-3 will remain at a level I, with a 1-hour fire watch required.




