Cache Site Containers Open Saturday, October 21st



Emergency Manager Rick Hudson invites you to join the cache container program, which provides citizens the opportunity to store barrels of supplies safely outside the Tsunami zone.

Opened to the public twice annually for tours and restocking, Cannon Beach's three cache sites will be accessible to visit from 11AM-1PM on Saturday, October 21st.

How the program works: Your personal cache container(s) are stored in secure buildings at the evacuation cache sites. The containers hold your personal cache of supplies to assist you and your family until the emergency passes. The most important and essential items you can store are a tent, tarps, sleeping bags, canned or dried foods, a means to cook or warm them, water, and warm clothing.

End of 2023 Fire Season

A message from Neal Bond, ODF Protection Unit Forester



The Oregon Department of Forestry, Astoria District, announced that effective Sunday, October 1, 2023, at 0100 hours: Industrial Fire Season, Regulated Use and the Countywide Burn Ban will officially end.

With the end of fire season, logging operations are no longer subject to fire protection laws, such as maintaining fire equipment at logging sites. This area includes all State, private and BLM forest lands in the Northwest

Area, which includes the Astoria, Tillamook, and Forest Grove Districts of the Oregon Department of Forestry. Burning logging slash does require a burning permit.

The Clatsop County Fire Defense Board has lifted the county wide burn ban. If you live within a fire district, please contact your local fire department to inquire about burn permits.

Recreationists are no longer required to carry a shovel and fire extinguisher or one gallon of water. ODF encourages everyone to be safe with fire in the forest. Always extinguish campfires with water and stirring with a shovel until cool to the touch before leaving the area.
