MEMORANDUM

RE: Tree Removal Permit 1116 S. Hemlock St., Taxlot 51030AD10402

January 2, 2024

A tree removal permit authorizing the removal of trees that have been identified as hazardous. The trees authorized for removal by this permit are:

• One cherry (*Prunus sp.*)

The application was submitted with a Tree Hazard Evaluation Form prepared by an ISA Certified Arborist as required by CBMC 17.70.030. The application and subject trees have been reviewed by an independent arborist on contract with the City and approval of the application has been recommended.

This removal application meets the criteria of CMBC 17.70.020(A) Permit Issuance - Criteria which states:

- A. Removal of a tree which poses a safety hazard. The applicant must demonstrate that:
 - 1. The condition or location of the tree presents either a foreseeable danger to public safety, or a foreseeable danger of property damage to an existing structure; and
 - 2. Such hazard or danger cannot reasonably be alleviated by pruning or treatment of the tree.

Replacement of the removed trees is required as per CBMC 17.70.040(B)(2) Tree Replacement Policy which states:

The basic standard is that four trees should be maintained on a five thousand square foot lot. For larger lots the standard will be applied on a proportional basis, e.g., a seven thousand five hundred square foot lot would require maintenance of six trees. This standard is to be implemented as follows:

- 2. Tree removal not in conjunction with construction:
 - a. If after tree removal the site maintains the standard of at least four trees per five thousand square feet, no replacement is required.
 - b. If after tree removal the site maintains the standard of at least four trees per five thousand square feet, the replanting of trees on a one-for-one basis may be required.
 - c. A minimum density of less than four trees per five thousand square feet may be permitted where it is found that the remaining trees provide sufficient cover, immature trees (those less than six inches diameter) will mature to provide adequate cover, or there are no reasonable locations for new trees.

Approved trees to be used for replanting are:

- Sitka spruce
- Western hemlock
- Douglas fir
- Western red cedar

- Red alder
- Mountain ash
- Big leaf maple
- Vine maple

As per the City's consulting arborist's report a replacement tree does not need to be planted in the same location as the one to be removed. The replacement tree may be planted at any of the properties belonging to the Cannon Beach Hotel Collection. The applicant shall advise the City where the replacement tree is being placed.

This permit may be appealed to the Planning Commission by filing an appeal with the City Manager within 14 days of the date of this decision.

Tree removal is for landscaping purposes, subject to the following conditions: The tree cannot exceed 10 inches in diameter. A landscape plan for the affected area must be <u>submitted and approved</u> by the City. The landscape plan must incorporate replacement trees for the trees removed. The replacement trees must be at least six feet in height or have a two-inch caliper; and, The City shall inspect the property one year after the approval of the permit to insure the landscape plan has been implemented.

If your tree presents an immediate danger of collapse and if such potential collapse represents a clear and present hazard to persons or property, please contact the Community Development Director (CDD). If it is determined by the CDD that there is an immediate danger, then a tree removal permit is not required prior to tree removal. However, within seven days after the tree removal, the tree owner shall make application for an after-the-fact permit. Where a tree presents an immediate danger of collapse, a complete ISA Tree Hazard Evaluation Form prepared by a certified arborist is not required. Where a safety hazard exists, as defined by this subsection, the city may require the tree's removal. If the tree has not been removed after forty-eight hours, the city may remove the tree and charge the costs to the owner.

Site visit with Cameron to assess health and vigor of trees and other shrubs on hotel properties.

Area 1> Cannon Beach Hotel.

Observed: Cherry tree located at SW corner of building defoliated. Cameron reported that the tree had few leaves throughout the growing season. Removal recommended. No replacement at this location (vehicle traffic, limited growth space).

Cherry tree at NW corner stressed, some deadwood and leaf drop early in fall season.

Recommendation is to prune tree to remove deadwood and shape tree for overall appearance. Area 2> Courtyard Inn.

This area has an abundance of shrubs including climbing hydrangea and roses. All are healthy specimens. These plants should only be pruned for shape in early spring. Guideline is to prune about Valentines Day.

Area 3> McBee.

There are five ornamental cherry trees on this site. All have a stressed appearance that attribute in part to the long dry spell this past summer. I recommend that no pruning be done until dormant season (December-end of January) and that the pruning be done by a qualified tree service with an initial inspection by me. The majority of shrubs are Escallonia. These plants can be pruned any time of the year to maintain size and shape. It is desirable to prune after bloom (usually fall) as new flowers are set on new wood.

Area 4> Hearthstone.

The shrubbery consists mainly of Escallonia that is quite dense and structurally imbalanced, meaning that the bulk of the foliage is mostly street side. This could result in breakage if a wet snowfall occurs. Pruning to reduce the end weight of the plants would be beneficial. If pruning is done incrementally over time then the plants will be structurally stable without losing the visual barrier from the rental units.





Tree Removal Permit Application Review - Cannon Beach Hotel

Per your request, I reviewed the Tree Removal Permit Application submitted by the Cannon Beach Hotel Collection. I visually inspected the tree and site on December 27th. It is my recommendation the removal request for 1 tree be granted.

The tree is a cherry species (*Prunus sp.*), located along southwest corner of the building (photo attached). The tree is approximately 7" in DBH and 15' tall. The tree is in a state of decline and will soon be dead. I recommend the removal request for this tree be granted according to permit Criteria C, "*The tree presents a safety hazard*." Replanting is not recommended at this site as growing space is limited. I recommend a tree be planted at another affiliated property.
