Planning Director Report

Design Review Board: No items were scheduled before the Design Review Board in September.

Planning Commission: The Planning Commission heard the following requests at its September 22 meeting:

- Oregon Coast Alliance (ORCA) appealed an administrative decision to approve remedial sand removal from the irrigation system at Breakers Point. The Planning Commission denied the appeal, upholding the permit.
- The Lodges at Cannon Beach requested approval for 18 hotel units adjacent to West Surfcrest. This was the re-authorization of a permit previously approved by the Planning Commission in 2006. The Planning Commission denied the request.
- The Planning Commission closed the public hearing and made recommendations for the City Council on changes to the tree removal ordinance.

Haystack Rock Awareness Program Report

General:

- Frances Holtman is officially leaving the Volunteer Coordinator position September 30th.
- Katie Corliss and Jesse Trott left mid-September to head back to college
 - We have 6 total seasonal staff remaining
- Our last day on the beach for the season is Thursday, October 27th
 - Friday, the 28th, will be spent cleaning out our truck and trailer
- Puffins have officially left the rock, along with USFW volunteers Tim Halloran and Carlene Hopkins
- All Discover Haystack Rock events have been completed for the season
 - Events, which include an hour long talk or activity followed by a guided tour of the tide pools, take place once a month and are aimed to increase awareness for the program as well as recruit volunteers
 - All events have had excellent turnout with 30-100 participants
- In the past month staff and volunteers have talked with over **15,000** visitors on the beach! Since the beginning of the beach season in February, HRAP staff and volunteers have made over **80,000** personal contacts, both on and off the beach!
- Melissa will propose to the Northwest Aquatic Marine Educators Organization, that the 2018 Oregon NAME Conference take place in Cannon Beach
- Lisa and Melissa have begun season planning for next year


- We will be handing out rack cards advertising "beach talks" one scheduled every Saturday with a \$10 suggested donation
- We will continue Discover Haystack Rock events with more activity based events in mind
- Farmers Market outreach has been excellent
 - We have made quite a bit in donations and spoken to hundreds of individuals interested in our program
- New USFW signs going up at various locations around the rock soon
 - The new "No Climbing" signs have a small foot print, but now include a phone number to call if a visitor sees someone climbing the rock *Education*:
- Since the beginning of the beach season, we have hosted **53** educational programs on the beach encompassing students and visitors from all age ranges and backgrounds
- For September, we have hosted two local area schools and one private tour for the visiting Costa Rica Tico's
- Reached out to Suzanna Kruger, a biology teacher with Seaside High School to assist with our Sea Star Survey on September 18th with members of her class
- Currently working on obtaining a \$28k grant for providing STEM extended learning to underprivileged youth
- Busy planning for the upcoming season and impatiently waiting for 2017 Tidal information

Volunteers:

- From February 1st, 2016 through mid-August we have 80+ volunteers and over 2,000+ volunteer hours.
- We are actively looking for volunteers to have more specific roles in the office, including but not limited to, updating the white board, assisting Lisa with Educational prep work, entering various data, and coordinating citizen science

Citizen Science:

- Volunteers (as well as some staff) continue to conduct monthly COASST seabird surveys on the beach as well as sea star surveys and marine debris surveys
 - During the last bird survey, on September 19th, we found 13 dead birds a nice, low number for this time of year
- In August we began partnering with Sleepy Monk Coffee Rosters and Sea Turtles Forever to conduct monthly microplastic cleanups

Cannon Beach Food Pantry Report: Nancy Littel

As of September 21, 2016, the Cannon Beach Food Pantry (CBFP) served 154 customers in 40 households: 98 adults and 56 children.

On this day last year, Cannon Beach Food Pantry served 74 customers in 22 households.

Today, CBFP served 80 more customers and 18 more households than last year! Since 7-11-2012, the highest number of customers served in one day is 180 (04-20-2016) and lowest number of customers served in one day is 30 (12-31-2013).

The highest number of households served in one day is 47 (11-18-2015) and lowest number of households served in one day is 08 (12-31-2013).
