Planning Commission: The Planning Commission met on October 25 to consider the following:

- Foredune Management Plan update: The public hearing on this item was closed in May. The Planning Commission continued its work on this item to the November 20 meeting.
- Tree removal ordinance amendments. The Planning Commission continued this item to November 20.
- SR18-04. The Planning Commission approved a setback reduction at 211 E Surfcrest to accommodate a garage.
- The Planning Commission conducted a work session to discuss the City's short-term rental program. A public hearing on potential short-term rental ordinance amendments is tentatively scheduled for Thursday January 24.

Design Review Board: The Design Review Board did not meet in October. The DRB's next meeting will be on Thursday November 15, 2018.

Other Planning/Building Matters:

- The Planning Director accompanied Parks & Community Services Committee members and consultant Barry Sims on a tour (9/20) of the upper Ecola Creek Forest Reserve as part of the City's update of the ECFR Stewardship Plan.
- Council member Brandon Ogilvie and Planning Director Mark Barnes attended a 9/24 meeting of Clatsop County's Affordable Housing Taskforce.
- The Planning Director attended a 9/25 meeting in Tillamook hosted by Tillamook County, and made a presentation on Cannon Beach's short-term rental program.
- The Department's Administrative Assistant attended a one-day (9/28) building permit technician training session offered through the Oregon Building Officials Association.
- The Building Official attended a code-update course (9/28) provided by the Oregon Building Officials Association.
- Planning Department staff met 10/19 with short-term rental management companies to discuss upcoming hearings on changes to the City's short-term rental regulations; to introduce new staff; and to discuss the services STR-Helper will be providing the City.
- The Community Development Director and Planning Director attended a 10/22 meeting in Astoria to discuss updating the County-wide Natural Hazard Mitigation Plan.
- The Planning Director attended a 10/25 meeting of the Columbia River Estuary Study Taskforce (CREST).

Public Works Department Report

Roads

- 2018-2019 Pave Preservation contract was awarded to ABCDE Paving and they are scheduled to pave the Wastewater Treatment Plant and three streets within Cannon Beach during October 22nd -November 7th weather permitting.
- Otak is in the process of engineering the S Curves project to replace the water line, giving us redundancy back between the north and south ends of town. Once the engineering is complete, an RFP for construction will be issued.
- Lancaster Engineering has completed the post evaluation of the Warren Way/Hemlock intersection. Options for replacing the temporary white plastic candlesticks currently in place has been identified. A summary of the report will be discussed during the upcoming November 15th Design Review Board meeting.
- The completion date for the Ash Street Water Line replacement project has been extended to November 7th. The project is going very well, the contractor just felt additional time was needed to ensure everything was completed to our scope specifications.

Wastewater

• Kennedy Jenks has been awarded the contract to Engineer the cover for our UV and Headworks at the WWT plant.

Water

• Water flow testing on all our fire hydrants throughout the city has begun and is scheduled for completion no later than December 31st.

Parks

- An RFP has been issued to secure an Arborist of record for the City of Cannon Beach. Bids are due back by Friday, October 19th at 2pm. Bids will be reviewed, and the results will be provided in next month's report
- The doors on the public restrooms at Spruce and 2nd are in the process of being removed and repainted. One set of restrooms will remain open for use during this process. The work will be completed during the week without impact to the weekend visitor restroom demand.
- Landscape maintenance continues, and final application of the semi-annual turf fertilizer has been applied.

- Reached out to Evergreen College regarding the possibility of providing a supply of Trash Talk jewelry pieces for a 50/50 split to support both our organizations while simultaneously creating opportunity for conversations surrounding plastic pollution. In addition, we would love to discuss offering a marine debris art workshop in the Spring of 2019.
- Was asked to facilitate Trash Talk workshops for 3 Girl Scout Troops. Forwarded to Lisa as she is the GST coordinator.

Beach Wheelchairs and Bilingual Interpretations – Inclusivity

- The beach wheelchair program is officially 1 year old!
- The beach wheelchair program has had 312 reservations for beach wheelchairs since October 5, 2017, including multiple reservations where party uses chair for a few days in a row.
- Wheelchairs currently has 5 future reservations, all for November.
- Wheelchair was reserved by one Spanish-only speaking family; they donated \$20.00.
- Wheelchairs program has earned approximately \$2,500 in donations, not including initial of \$6,500.
- Andrea has translated over a dozen of the beach signs used by the HRAP interpreters.
- Andrea has served as the bilingual interpreter on the beach, connecting with several Spanishonly speaking groups and educating them about the tidepools and marine life.

- Wheelchairs has gotten a lot of feedback about adding a third chair to the program, with over a dozen mentions when physically given a donation.
- The wheelchair program is currently in a position to acquire a third wheelchair, however a third wheelchair would definitely entail needing to have a full time position. Even with two beach wheelchairs, Andrea has had to be very careful when saving reservations so as to not go over her hours. Some 85 people have been placed on the cancellation list and the cancellation list has only been utilized 12 times. A full-time position would open more time for more visitors to use the beach chairs and donate to the program.
- Many people are now starting to do "walk-ins," where they don't make a reservation, but instead come in to City Hall to see if they can check out a beach wheelchair. Most walk-ins were on the beach and saw the beach wheelchair being used, asked about the information from the wheelchair user and then came straight over to City Hall to take a chair, make a future reservation, and even just donate.
- Beach wheelchairs had 3 weddings where the wheelchair was reserved after normal wheelchairs hours (9:00a to 5:00p, the wedding reservations were 5:00p to 8:00p) and Andrea worked with these families personally to ensure their big days remained special. Each of these families donated at least \$50.
